Joyce Cook joined FIFA in November 2016 as its Chief Member Associations Officer and a member of FIFA's Senior Management Board. In September 2019, she was appointed as the first FIFA Chief Social Responsibility and Education Officer responsible for the organization's Human Rights and Anti-Discrimination, Child Protection and Safeguarding, and Sustainability and Environment programmes.

An openly gay woman working in football and a champion of diversity and inclusion, Cook has been active in this sector for almost 20 years. In 2009, she founded the Centre for Access to Football in Europe and has served as a board member at FARE, Women in Football, the English FA Inclusion Advisory Board, the Sports Grounds Safety Authority and other equality advisory groups and boards.

In 2017, Cook was awarded a CBE in the Queen's New Year's Honours (UK) for services to disability and sports at national and international levels.

Tatjana has been the Managing Director of LATCAM for one year. After obtaining her Licence in Hispanic and Russian literature and history from University of Geneva in 1987, she worked at the World Economic Forum for seven years, where she was first in charge of Eastern European and later of Latin American corporate members and politicians at the Annual Meeting in Davos and at other summits.

In 1996, she moved to Zurich, where she worked for over 20 years in the financial services industry. As a Senior Relationship Manager in the international private banking divisions at UBS, Mirabaud Banquiers Privés, Liechtensteinische Landesbank and Cornèr Banca, she was in charge of high net worth clients in Central and Eastern Europe.

In 2017, she left the banking industry and obtained her Diploma in Systemic and Business Coaching as well as Team and Online Training at Onken Academy, Uster. Ambassador Mirko Giulietti

Mirko Giulietti was born in 1964 in Lugano, Ticino, and he is originally from the Canton of Zurich. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Economic and Social Sciences from the University of Geneva; a Master's degree in Urban and Land Use Planning from ETH Zurich, as well as a LL.M. (Diplôme d'Etudes Supérieures, DES) in International Human Rights Law from the University of Louvain-la-Neuve (Belgium).

After several missions for the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in Colombia, Afghanistan and Rwanda, and for the Organization for the Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Mirko Giulietti joined the Swiss diplomatic service in 1999. He did his practice in Bern and at the Permanent Mission of Switzerland to the United Nations in New York.

In 2001, he was transferred to Bern to the Political Division III (International Organizations) and in 2004, he held the post of First Secretary at the Swiss Mission to NATO in Brussels. Back in Bern in 2007, he has been appointed Deputy Head of the Human Rights Policy section. In 2010 he was transferred to Mexico as Deputy Head of Mission, and served subsequently as Deputy Head of Mission in Nairobi from 2014 to 2016, when he has been appointed by the Federal Council Ambassador to Costa Rica, El Salvador, Nicaragua and Panama (with residence in San José de Costa Rica). Since August 2020, he acts as Assistant Secretary of State for the Americas.

Mirko Giulietti is married and has two sons and a daughter.

Minister Hervé Lohr

Hervé Lohr is Minister, Deputy Head of the Bilateral Economic Relations and Head of the Americas at the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO). He is in charge with his team of trade and investment relations between Switzerland and the countries in the Americas. Previously, he held the position of Deputy Permanent Representative of Switzerland to the OECD, Paris (2016-2019).

Prior to that (2009-2015), Hervé worked at the International Economic Law Division at SECO, becoming its Head in 2012. In that capacity, he led free trade negotiations in legal related matters with China, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Indonesia, India, Ukraine and the Central American States.

Before working for SECO, Hervé served as Head European Affairs of the Canton of Zurich (2005-2008), counseling and representing the canton's executive in the negotiations on an air traffic agreement between Switzerland and Germany. Hervé was also the acting Head of the Division International Agreements and Cooperation at the State Secretariat for Migrations (2000-2005), in this capacity he elaborated and led migration dialogue processes with countries of origin and transit of migration, in Sub-Saharan Africa, Near- and Middle East, Asia and the CIS countries. At the beginning of his career (1995-2000), he was a Policy Advisor for *Médecins Sans Frontières* and conducted various field visits and missions in different capacities in Sub-Saharan Africa, Caucasus, South East Asia and Latin America.

Hervé holds a Law degree from the University of Neuchâtel and an LL.M. degree in International Economic Law from the University of Zurich. In addition to his mother tongue French, he is fluent in English, German and Spanish.

Until October 2019, he was Deputy Assistant Secretary for Bilateral Economic Affairs and Head of the Americas Unit at the Swiss Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research. He held the diplomatic title of Minister. Previously, he dealt with WTO matters (1999-2004) in charge i.a. of investment and China's accession to the WTO; Rules of origin, Customs matters and Government Procurement (1992-1999), and the European Area Agreement Negotiations (1988-1992).

Mr. Nell holds a Ph. D from the Graduate School of International Studies of the University of Denver and Masters from the Universities of Fribourg, Carleton (Ottawa) and Denver. He is Privat Doцент at the University of Fribourg where he dispenses courses.
